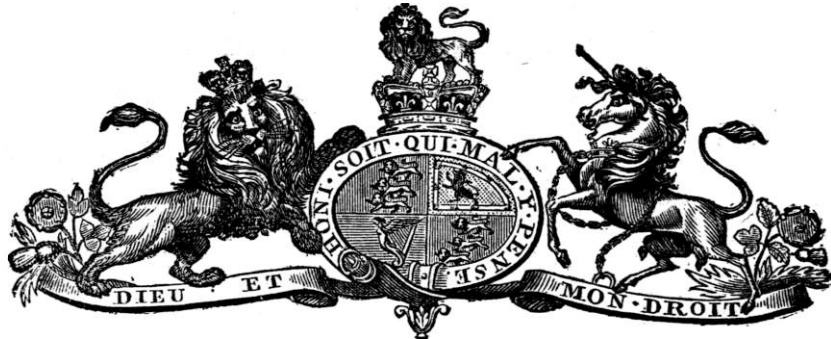

[*New Munster Ordinances.*]

SESSION I. No. I.

AN ORDINANCE to Naturalize certain Persons in the Province of New Munster. NATURALIZATION.

[*23rd August, 1849.*]

WHEREAS the persons particularly described in the Schedule to this Ordinance annexed have recently settled in this Province, and it is expedient that there should be removed from them (within the Province) the disabilities to which aliens are by law subject. Preamble.

1. Be it enacted by His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of New Munster, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—All and singular the persons who are particularly described in the Schedule hereunto annexed shall be to all intents and purposes whatsoever, within the Province of New Munster, deemed and taken to be and to have been, from the date set opposite their respective names in the said Schedule, natural born subjects of Her Majesty, as if they had respectively been born within the realm of England. Persons described in Schedule to be naturalized.

2. Be it enacted, That this Ordinance do take effect from the day of the passing of the same. Commencement of Ordinance.
