Title. Preamble. 1. Short Title. 2. Township of Pukekohe declared a borough on certain conditions. Schedule.

1887, No. 21.-Local.

An Act to authorize the constitution of Pukekohe as a Borough. Title. [23rd December, 1887.

WHEREAS there are not a sufficient number of householders Preamble. resident at Pukekohe, in the County of Manukau, as the same is described in the Schedule hereto, to petition the Governor that the said district should be constituted a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886:"

And whereas certain public works are necessary to be made in the said district to secure the public health of the inhabitants thereof, and it is requisite for such purpose that the said inhabitants should be incorporated : And whereas under the circumstances of the case it is expedient that the above-mentioned district should be specially created a borough under the Act hereinabove last mentioned :

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :----

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The Pukekohe Borough Act, Short Title. 1887."

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in section twenty-four Township of Pukeof "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," the Governor may, by kohe declared Proclamation, declare the lands described in the Schedule hereto a on certain borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," subject to the following conditions :----

- (1.) That a petition is presented to the Governor, signed by not less than fifty resident householders within the said area, praying the Governor to constitute the same a borough under "The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886:"
- (2.) That all the requirements of " The Municipal Corporations Act, 1886," (except those contained in subsection three of section twenty-four of the said Act) shall have been complied with,

## SCHEDULE.

## THE BOROUGH OF PUKEKOHE.

ALL that area in the Provincial District of Auckland commencing at a point in Allotment No. 98 of Section No. 2 of small lots in the Pukekohe Settlement, at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the road, which forms its north-eastern boundary, such point being the termination of a right line running parallel to and at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the road, which forms the north-western boundary of Allotment No. 23 of Section No. 1 of the aforesaid settlement. Bounded towards the North-west generally by a line running from the point aforesaid parallel to and at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the road, which forms the north-western boundary of Allotment No. 23 aforesaid, the north-western boundaries of Allotments Nos. 24, 25, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, and 32, the north-western and northern boundary of Allotment No. 33, and the northern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 34, 6, and 125, all of Section No. 1 aforesaid, to a point within Allotment No. 5, at a distance of 3 chains to the westward of the middle of the road, which forms its eastern boundary; thence Northerly and North-easterly by a line running parallel to and at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the last-named road, which road forms the south-eastern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 4, 3, 2, and 1, all of Section No. 1 aforesaid, produced to a point in Allotment No. 1 of Section No. 1 aforesaid, thence easterly by a line running parallel to, and 3 chains distant from, the middle of the road which forms the southern boundary of Allotment No. 59, and by the right line aforesaid produced easterly to a point within Allotment No. 1 of Section No. 4, lying at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the road, which forms the western boundary of the latter allotment; thence by a right line running Southerly parallel to and at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the last-described road as far as the southern boundary line of Allotment No. 1 aforesaid, and thence continuing easterly along the southern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 1 and 2 for a distance of  $22\frac{1}{2}$  chains; towards the East generally by a line running at right angles from the place last named to the southern boundary of Section No. 16 of the Parish of Pukekohe; thence Westerly along part of the southern boundary of Section No. 16 aforesaid for a distance of  $22\frac{1}{2}$  chains; thence Southerly by a line running parallel to and at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the road, which forms the western boundary of Section No. 39, also of the Parish of Pukekohe aforesaid, to a point within the said section, being the termination of another right line lying parallel to and at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the road, which forms the southern boundary of Allotment No. 17 of Section No. 2 aforesaid; towards the South by the right line last named running westerly parallel to and at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the aforesaid road, which also forms the southern boundaries of Allotments Nos. 16, 25, 22, 281, 38B, 38A, 52, 51, 50, and 49, also of Section No. 2 aforesaid, to a point within Allotment No. 64, being the termination of another right line running parallel to and at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the road, which forms the western boundary of Allotment No. 49 aforesaid; and towards the West generally by the right line last named running northerly and north-westerly parallel to and at a distance of 3 chains from the middle of the aforesaid road, which also forms the western boundary of Allotment No. 48 of Section No. 2 aforesaid, and the south-western boundaries of Allotments Nos. 84, 21, and 23, of Section No. 1 of small lots in the Settlement of Pukekohe aforesaid, and by the aforesaid right line continued to the point of commencement.
