2. Power to lease Auckland City Market for a term not exceeding ten years. '3. Power to Council to lease certain land for a term not exceeding fifty years.

AN ACT to enable the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City Title. of Auckland (hereinafter called "the City Council") (a) to lease the Auckland City Market for any Term not exceeding Ten Years, (b) to lease a Part of the Land formerly known as Fort Britomart Reserve and Public Road for any Term [23rd November, 1903. not exceeding Fifty Years.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :---

1. The Short Title of this Act is "The City of Auckland Short Title. Empowering Act, 1903."

2. The power vested in the Council of the said City of Auckland Power to lease by section three hundred and sixty-nine of "The Municipal Corpora- Auckland City Market for a term tions Act, 1900," shall, with reference to the property now known as not exceeding ten the Auckland City Market, and having entrances from Queen, Cook, Albert, and Wellesley Streets, be hereinafter read and construed as though the words "three years" where they occur in the said section had been deleted therefrom and the words "ten years" inserted in lieu thereof.

3. The power vested in the City Council by section two hundred Power to Council to and one of the said last-mentioned Act shall, with reference to such for a term not part of the property described in the Schedule to the local Act called exceeding fifty "The Auckland Harbour Act 1874 Amendment Act, 1883," as is now vested in the City Council and is not now laid out or used as apublic road, be read and construed as though the words "twenty-one years" where they occur in the said section had been deleted therefrom and the words "" fifty years " inserted in lieu thereof.
