Title.

An Act to enable the Corporation of the City of Dunedin to take, divert, impound, collect, use, and appropriate for the Purpose and as Part of the Waterworks for the Time being of the said City the Waters known as the "Lee Stream," and all and every of the Tributaries thereof. [27th October, 1917.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Act may be cited as the Dunedin Waterworks Extension Act, 1917.

Power to do certain works.

2. The said Corporation is hereby empowered to take, divert, impound, collect, use, and appropriate for the purpose and as part of the waterworks for the time being of the said city the waters known as the "Lee Stream," and all and every of the tributaries thereof, and all and every waters that may from time to time be diverted or brought into or connected with the Lee Stream or the waters thereof.

Not empowered to compensate.

3. Save as hereinafter provided, the said Corporation shall not make any compensation in money or otherwise to any person (if any) whose rights shall be extinguished, abridged, interfered with, or otherwise prejudically affected by the exercise of the powers hereinbefore given to the said Corporation to take, divert, impound, collect, use, and appropriate the waters hereinbefore mentioned.

Compensation for land taken.

4. Compensation for and in respect of land taken under or injuriously affected by the said powers hereinbefore given to the said Corporation by this Act shall be assessed and disposed of in manner provided by the Public Works Act, 1908.

5. The powers hereinbefore given to the said Corporation shall saving of existing be subject to the rights (if any) of Fred William Knight, of Dunedin, land agent, Mary Snell Knight, his wife, and William Edward Short Knight, of Dunedin, private hotelkeeper, who allege that they are the proprietors of a water-race held under license No. 1698, dated the twenty-seventh day of April, eighteen hundred and sixtyeight, under the Mining Act, 1908, and as such proprietors are entitled to six sluice-heads of water from Shepherd's Creek, a tributary of Lee Stream; and also to the rights (if any) of James Bolton and Thomas Bolton, both of Waipori, miners, who allege that they are the proprietors of a water-race held under license No. 9001, dated the fifteenth day of January, eighteen hundred and ninety-five, under the Mining Act, 1908, and as such proprietors are entitled to eight sluice-heads of water from Shepherd's Creek aforesaid.

6. If the parties concerned do not come to an agreement the Assessment of amount of compensation shall be fixed by a Court composed of the Warden of the district and two expert assessors, to be appointed by the Governor-General in Council. Compensation for water-rights shall be fixed in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (i) of section one hundred and fifteen of the Mining Act, 1908, but shall be payable by the Dunedin City Corporation, and not by the

Government.

7. From and after the passing of this Act no licenses for Water- Restriction of grant races or other mining privileges shall hereafter be granted to any of mining privileges. person under the provisions of the Mining Act, 1908, or otherwise in respect of or from the waters of the Lee Stream, or any of the tributaries thereof, or in, over, or upon the watersheds thereof respectively, which might in any way affect the rights or powers of the said Corporation under or in respect of this Act.
